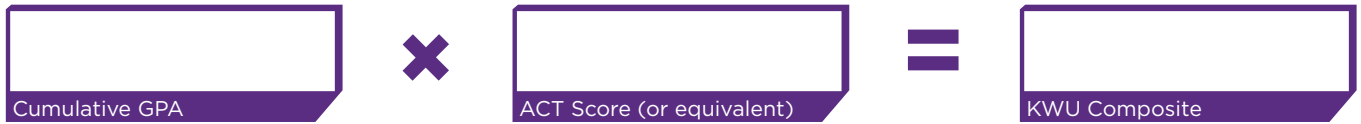

SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic scholarships:

Read on to see what you qualify for.



Presidential Scholarship — \$12,000 (off-campus \$9,000)

- High school seniors with a KWU composite* greater than or equal to 94
- Transfer students with a 3.5 GPA in 24 or more transferring, graded credit hours
- Renewable with a KWU cumulative resident GPA of 2.50
- **First-time freshmen are eligible to compete for the 90% Tuition Eisenhower Scholarship**

Dean's Scholarship — \$10,000 (off-campus \$7,000)

- High school seniors with a KWU composite* greater than or equal to 63
- Transfer students with a 3.0 GPA in 24 or more transferring, graded credit hours
- Renewable with a KWU cumulative resident GPA of 2.50

University Scholarship — \$8,000 (off-campus \$5,000)

- High school seniors with a KWU composite* greater than or equal to 45
- Transfer students with a 2.25 GPA in 24 or more transferring, graded credit hours
- Renewable with a KWU cumulative resident GPA of 2.50

Promise Scholarship — \$4,000 (off-campus \$2,000)

- High school seniors with a KWU composite* greater than or equal to 43
- Transfer students with a 2.0 GPA in 24 or more transferring, graded credit hours
- Renewable with a KWU cumulative resident GPA of 2.0

up to \$4,000 Power of _____ Award

KWU helps you leverage out-of-class activities into success! We call it The Power of AND. Whether you want to continue in a favorite activity or get involved in internships or community service, you will receive a Power Award to recognize your contributions to the KWU pack.



Residential Transfer students may qualify for a \$1,200 scholarship.

Scholarships assume full-time, on-ground enrollment and compliance with all policies. Power Scholarships are greatest for students that live on campus. Power scholarships are less for commuters and are reduced if students move off campus.

*Calculate your KWU composite by multiplying your cumulative high school GPA by your ACT score.
(GPA is based on a 4.0 scale; KWU converts SAT results to an ACT equivalent)

Federal Aid

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible after October 1. KWU's Federal Code is 001929.



State Aid

Kansas residents who demonstrate financial need qualify for up to \$3,500 per year from the State of Kansas. Complete the FAFSA by April 1 to ensure you are eligible to be considered for this award.



Phi Theta Kappa

Members of Phi Theta Kappa are eligible for additional merit aid. Talk to your admissions counselor about whether you qualify.
